Efficient

Unifies Language Arts

Spell to Write and Read integrates phonics, spelling, penmanship, reading, creative writing, and grammar into one program instead of separate subjects. Key spelling concepts are reviewed repeatedly for four or five years. Rather than holding back students until they master each phonogram or spelling rule thoroughly, we move ahead, keeping them excited while knowing that the same concepts will be specifically addressed again for further mastery.

Economical

Provides Great Value

Elevates Teacher Confidence

I had nine years teaching experience, but lacked confidence. In desperation, I took this course. During the training class, I realized much of my discouragement and disillusionment came from not knowing how to teach properly. Equipped with the tools I had needed all along, I confidently had the pleasure of teaching little ones to read. I am full of praise!

Presents Hows and Whys

My daughter reads far above grade level and my son associates sounds and the words they make. They are learning to reason as well as read. They know the whys of English and not just the hows.

Improves Scores in Days

In thirty-seven days, my ten-year-old daughter's spelling level jumped from 6.0 to 8.0, and my nine-year-old daughter increased from 2.5 to 3.5. Initially my seven-year-old son missed every word on the test. (He spelled *can* as *kan*, *now* as *naw*, *good* as *grd*, *all* as *orl*, and *make* as *mac*.) I hadn't realized how little he learned in public school. With SWR, in eighty-six days, he could spell at a 2.2!

Boosts Special Needs Students

I had been told that my learning disabled child would never be able to learn to read. I introduced Wanda's materials anyway when she was young. She needed lots of loving repetition. At sixteen years old, my Downs Syndrome daughter's word attack skills tested at 12.8. Her reading level is consistently between 6th and 7th grade! We've been teaching our eight-year-old very "low key" for over a year now. She is reading and writing in her spelling log. She also reads easy books and sounds out signs and words she sees along the way!

Activates Weak Speller

My fourth grade son trailed a year and a half below grade level when we started. I began at the beginning and progressed step-by-step. Aaron liked it right away, because he was actively involved by hearing, seeing, writing and saying. This multisensory approach is the best method. Usually reading instruction is fragmented. He is proud of the spelling log he is creating. We have covered over 500 words. He still shows a lot of interest in what has been his weakest subject.
